FRAMING – 6 WEEK COURSE

The Regina Trades & Skills Centre is offering an introductory Wood Construction Framing course designed to prepare students for entry-level work in the framing industry. Participants will gain essential knowledge, practical hands-on skills, and industry-recognized certifications. Training includes safe and effective use of common tools (tape measure, speed square, chalk line, saws, hammer/nail gun, level), accurate measuring and layout, wall assembly, squaring, and general wood frame construction.

REQUIREMENTS

- MUST BE A CANADIAN CITIZEN, PERMANENT RESIDENT OR POSSESS AN OPEN WORK PERMIT TO APPLY
- SATCC requirements for apprenticeship are Grade 10 Math & Science
- A Criminal Record and Vulnerable Sector Check may be required by your work placement
- Grade 12 Recommended
- Valid Class 5 Driver's License required
- English Language Requirement (CLB Level 6 required for Apprenticeship)
- Compliance to RTSC's fit for duty policy
